





The Kukang Rescue Program in 2017




The Kukang Rescue Program is focused on combating illegal wildlife trade and on conservation of Greater slow loris (*Nycticebus coucang*) in Indonesia, especially in the North Sumatra province. This report is a summary of events that took place in Sumatra, the Czech Republic and also on the internet in 2017.

Rescue and rehabilitation centre in Sumatra

At the end of 2017, the rescue and rehabilitation centre in Sumatra was extended by another part of approximately 1 ha area. The size of the whole land is now around 2.5 ha. On the new part of the land stands a building which will serve as an office and space for all the employees of the organization, for volunteers and visitors. In the past year, this building underwent an extensive reconstruction during which four semi-open rooms, a conference room, a dining room and new toilettes for visitors were built. This office building will enable to fully close the rehabilitation part of the centre to visitors so all the necessary quarantine and safety conditions can be preserved.

The clinic is currently equipped with basic tools and material. We would like to give the animals, often having gone through a very painful past, as good care as possible. Animals whose teeth have been drastically torn or pulled out often suffer from mouth infections and strong pain. To help such animals and to end their pain due to

which they only hardly can eat, it is key to perform a thorough dental check-up and to suggest an appropriate cure. This is why we need to equip our clinic with inhalation anesthesia which will allow manipulation and professional care during which handled animals feel no pain. Thanks to great 170 donors who joined a successful crowdfunding campaign on www.darujme.cz at the end of 2017, we have managed to collect the whole needed amount of 150,000 CZK which will enable us to purchase an inhalation anesthesia for our clinic! Therefore, we will be able to treat animals with various injuries and to perform even complicated interventions. Some donors are still donating money within this collection (https://www.darujme.cz/projekt/1200449) thanks to which we can buy even more necessary material.

Thanks to the grant for 2018 which we have succeeded to gain from The Rufford Foundation for the third time, the centre will be extended by more rehabilitation cages in following months. Also thanks to several generous donors, new pre-releasing cages will be constructed to become the last phase of rehabilitation of slow lorises before they get transported to habituation enclosures in their natural environment and eventually released.

Raising awareness about illegal wildlife trade and conservation of slow lorises Indonesia:

In the past year, education of chosen communities and general public was one of the key activities of the program in Sumatra. We have decided to support a local community in a village of Kuta Male so that the local people appreciate their natural wealth and protect, not hunt, slow lorises and other endangered animal species. Thanks to the support of the two general partners, Ostrava Zoo and Olomouc Zoo and also thanks support of the Cleveland Metroparks, a library focused on environmental education was built for children from the local community. The library is managed by external program assistants, Jhon Kartasima Gurusinga and Rukur Kita Perangin-angin. In the library, children can borrow books donated by the Green-books.org organization and The Prague British School, and also English courses led by volunteers take place there.

Another library established on the same principle and equipped thanks to books donated by the same organizations was opened together with the English-Environmental school for children. Our program leads this school in the Bandar Baru village in the close neighbourhood of the rescue and rehabilitation centre, and the school is regularly attended by 25 students. Three times a week, children can attend free lessons and borrow book in the school and library where they are supervised by our educational team. At the end of 2016/2017, not only did we award the best students, but we also equipped the school with new tables, seat mats and other tools for children.

In the past year, we also organized two awareness events in public places located close to the rescue centre (a popular tourist area with Rajah Berneh hot springs and the Berastagi city which is situated in proximity to two

famous volcanos, Sibayak and Sinabung). These are places with high concentration of people who are likely to become potential buyers or even slow loris hunters. The Indonesian team together with several Czech volunteers informed the public thanks to discussions and information materials showing that purchasing slow lorises is illegal and that they are unsuitable pets.

Work of anti-conflict team has resulted in a publication titled: "How to protect a farm against animals, while letting them live". This brochure aims to help mainly farmers living close to forest with protection of their farms against animals entering the farms, without having to kill them. One part of the brochure is also educational, informing about biology of particular animal species, conservation of endangered animal species living close to the farms, and about results of a year-long work of the anti-conflict team consisting of both Indonesian members and foreign volunteers of The Kukang Rescue Program. To enhance attractiveness, the brochure has been supplemented by many photographs of the anti-conflict team and by wonderful drawings of animals created by artists Marion Schön and Judith MacKay from the ABUN (Artists & Biologists Unite for Nature) artist group.





In the "I Am Not Your Toy!" campaign, we have started to focus also on so called "Responsible tourism". For this purpose, an article and educational leaflet was made. It is available for free download and sharing here: http://kukang.org/en/responsible-tourism. Many activities were carried out by a group of volunteers cooperating as a "Kukang Revolt" on the internet, where they actively react on any popularization of slow lorises as pets (websites, social media etc.). These volunteers address and inform tourists on social media about responsibility during traveling and about the need to avoid tourist attractions, such as taking photos with wild animals for money by which they actually support illegal trade in these animals. One of the victims of this current trend has Rytmus also been the popular Slovak here: rapper (more https://www.facebook.com/IAmNotYourToy/posts/1534322699978130). To support the "I Am Not Your Toy!" animator Žofie Zajíčková has created a new animation (can be viewed https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=4M3Upf4gYk8) which was projected before every movie in the Lucerna Cinema in Prague and in the Multicinema Golden Apple Cinema in Zlín during August and September. Field work

In 2017, the first phase of evaluation of a chosen locality as appropriate or inappropriate for possible future release of our rehabilitated slow lorises took place. The process of releasing animals that got from captivity back into the wild is very complex and difficult both in the question of time and finances. If any detail was underestimated, such a step could quite easily cause more harm than good – not only could the release harm the released individuals, but it could also be very dangerous for the whole wild population. The Kukang Rescue Program is trying to follow IUCN 'Guidelines for Reintroductions and Other Conservation Translocations' of animals. As the first step of preparations for release of individuals back into the wild, we have started with evaluation of food sources, predation and possible hunting pressure. We are also preparing the first phase of slow loris population size (i.e. abundance) estimate and determination of so called Abundance Index. Gradually, we are setting 10 transects where this estimate will be conducted. Another part of this work is also evaluation of habitat types on these transects, plant composition of the forest and comparison of results with other studies which performed the same method. All this field work will serve to maximize and then evaluate success of the pilot release of slow lorises that we plan to realize in this area. Besides several field assistants and volunteers, most intense work on this task has been currently done by Johana Rotterová in cooperation with Stanislav Lhota.

In conclusion



The foundation was established in July 2017 and is registered under number AHU-0010398.AH.01.04. Tahun 2017. Since its beginning, this foundation has been covering all activities of The Kukang Rescue Program in Indonesia. František Příbrský and Lucie Čižmářová are the founders.

In the Czech Republic, 2017 was the first year when Czech activities of the Kukang program were covered by the Czech non-profit organization The Kukang Rescue Program, z.s. registered under ID: 05611717.
